



This month I write my report as the new Chair of the Parish Council. I have some big boots to fill, all I can say is that I will try my hardest.

I would like to begin by thanking Sue McKendrick for her time and hard work put in over the previous three years and for

Sadly, I missed the celebrations here as we were away on holiday with our family, however I have heard from many people what a great day it was for all. This is down to the many groups and individuals involved in the organisation of the event on the Parish Memorial Ground and other celebrations. I'm sure I speak for everyone when I say a big thank you to all who came together to arrange these celebrations.

Full details of the July PC meeting will be published as usual on the PC website and the Parish noticeboards, but I will include a few points which may be of interest in this report.

The topic of hedge cutting was raised. As spring is progressing, the verges and hedges are growing at an astounding rate. Some hedges on Parish boundaries have been reported by parishioners with requests that the PC cut them. Whilst we appreciate that some of our boundary hedges may be causing frustration and inconvenience, we have to follow local government guidelines. In order to protect nesting birds, Leicestershire County Council state that routine cutting is restricted to between October and February - at any other time hedges should only be cut if there is a safety issue. Failure to comply with this could result in the Parish Council facing prosecution, so please bear with us on this matter.

The topic of more allotments in the Parish was again raised. ODAPC have been advised that the land they have identified could be used for allotments but we need to put in an application for this and obtain it officially. This would involve some financial outlay. As waiting lists for allotments are growing throughout the District, we are happy to move forward with this but we need to know that there are people in the Parish prepared to initiate this project before we commit to securing the land. To find out more, please speak to a Parish Councillor or contact Kelly Grove. You will have the full support of the Parish Council and our District Councillor.
