Oakthorpe, Donisthorpe and Acresford Parish Council, March 2023

Council held its monthly meeting on 8th March and as always there was much to discuss. Thank you to those who took time out to attend the meeting on a very cold and snowy evening.



It was pleasing to see a low number of recorded offences in last month's Police Report. We also received data from the Speed Survey on Church Street in Donisthorpe last year. The Speed Signs we now have in each village will collect data to help understand where speeding is taking place, and to what degree. A new Speed Watch scheme is in the process of being set up through the Donisthorpe Neighbourhood Watch group, and 20 volunteers across the Parish have signed up for the training - a fantastic response.

A partnership agreement was signed by the Chair of the ODA Memorial Gardens group and the Chair of the council. This sets out what Council and the group commit to, whilst completing the project to improve the grounds, a key Parish asset.

To commemorate the coronation of King Charles, three trees will be planted in the Parish, one at each of our schools and one in the memorial garden at Acresford.

At times, we hear people say, 'What does Council do?'. I'd say we work hard to ensure our Parish is one to be proud of. At the last meeting we reviewed the list of projects we committed to complete, and a report will come out soon detailing just what can be achieved during one term of Council when everyone works together.

This is my last report for Council and my final term in office. After 15 years it's time for me to move on and focus on other priorities in my life. My Councillor journey began as a Town Councillor with Ashby Woulds where I had the privilege of being elected Mayor on 3 occasions. I was a District Councillor and finally, since 2019, a Councillor with our Parish Council. It's been a real privilege to serve all communities. It has also been challenging, hard work, always worthwhile and rewarding. I'd like to thank all my colleagues and the Parish Manager for their endless support, it's been quite a ride! Our community is so fortunate to have many who contribute to a range of active voluntary groups, and I'd like to say thank you for your impressive work.

For anyone thinking of joining the Parish Council and is successfully elected at the coming election on May 4th, my advice is take time to understand your role, understand what is expected of you, what the rules are and how much of a contribution you can make in representing the community.

It's a journey I didn't think I could make when I was first approached to join the Town Council 15 years ago, yet soon realised it's a journey everyone who cares about their Parish, can make. We all have something to offer. Good luck.
