as we are in relation to what season we are in! A number of the items under review and discussion at the current time are focused on looking forward and to brighter days around the Parish. The Friends of ODA made an excellent presentation on a wide range of proposed community events in the coming year from quiz nights, village field days and bands in the park. Their focus, like ours, is to bring the community of the villages together and celebrate, as well as to recognise what an excellent range of events and people we have in our area.

The Parish Council is here to work for you, and the majority of matters discussed are focused on improving the places you live in. DONISTHORPE EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM

Donisthorpe is lucky enough to have an Emergency Response Team made up of volunteers from the local community. The Emergency Response Team was created 5 years ago to provide an immediate response to local disasters and disruptive or harmful events that could endanger people of the community or their property.

The benefits of the Emergency Response Team are that all members are local to Donisthorpe and therefore know the area well, know many of the community members and are likely to be able to attend a scene relatively quickly compared to the emergency services. The team is also equipped with basic first aid, search and rescue, traffic control and flood prevention equipment.

IMPORTANT:

It is very important to note that the Emergency Response Team is not an alternative to the Emergency Services. For any situation requiring the Police, Fire or Ambulance services, you should dial 999.

Emergencies in Donisthorpe are thankfully very rare, but could include situations such as securing areas threatened by fire or flood, helping to locate missing persons, traffic control, helping to deal with the aftermath of extreme weather, or even aiding residents and traffic following rare events such as aeroplane accidents.

For a good working Council the decision needs to be made by a vote of Parishioners. So please vote if there is an election.
