## Brilliant turnout to celebrate Coalville Park's 125th birthday



Hundreds of people flocked to Coalville Park to mark its 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, for a special event set up by North West Leicestershire District Council (NWLDC) and Friends of Coalville Park.

On the weekend of Saturday 29 June and Sunday 30 June, hundreds of people enjoyed two days of festivities, with live music, children's entertainment, street food and community stalls. NWLDC has thanked Everyone Active for sponsoring the event, Aggregate Industries and the Bardon Hill Quarry Community Fund for funding the event and Friends of Coalville Park for organising the Community Sports Day on Saturday, as well as all the stall holders, all the bands and entertainment, and everyone that came to support.

As part of the celebrations, a time capsule has been buried in Coalville Park which Leicestershire's Lord Lieutenant Mr Michael Kapur and Deputy Chairman Councillor Ray Morris unveiled.

The capsule is set to be opened in 2074, in 50 years' time, and includes objects and posters from local schools and community groups to remind people of the work that goes on in the local area. Councillor Tony Gillard, Portfolio Holder for Business and Regeneration at NWLDC, said: "Our Celebrate Coalville Park's 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary event was a major success, having everything from live music to dance troupes to children's rides and much more.

## Green Shoots Grant Scheme 2024

# Now open for applications until Sunday 1st September 2024

Green Shoots grants are available to constituted community groups and Parish Councils to help communities brighten up their areas in spring.

The following bulb varieties are available to order this year:

**Mixed Bulb Species** 

- Spring bulb mixture comprising of: Crocus Large Flowered Mixed, Tulip Rainbow Mixed, Daffodil & Narcissi Mixed
- Long Season bulb mixture Comprising of: Snowdrops, Crocus, Narcissi, Tulips, Mixed Alliums

#### **Individual Bulb Species**

- Daffodils
- Crocus (mixed)
- Tulips (naturalising mixed)
- Narcissi (mixed)
- Snowdrops

How many bulbs can we select?

Bulbs are provided in multiples of 1,000 bulbs. The minimum order is 2,000 bulbs. For example, this could be a combination of 1,000 daffodils and 1,000 crocus.

#### How much will the bulbs cost?

The bulb prices are in the table below. NWLDC will cover 50% of the cost of the bulbs. Parish Councils and community groups will pay the other 50% plus a delivery charge. Please email grants@nwleicestershire.gov.uk with any queries about this scheme.
