Our MP, Dr. Luke Evans, and his wife spent a good couple of hours at the event, speaking to people. ODAPC Councillors and the Clerk who were also present, had a long, positive conversation with him too.

The Police will carry on focusing on our Parish speeding problem and have done some speed checks, but this is an ongoing concern that seems to be one of our main issues. The more people that can help, the more speed watches we can do as a Parish, and the more likely we are to be able to deal with the issue.

We will be walking towards Acresford to lay a wreath at the Memorial Gardens in remembrance of our local heroes that lost their lives in the wars.

#### **Apple Day**

Another enjoyable Apple Day in the orchard; now an important part of our annual calendar. There were folksongs for much of the time by several artists, plus a wonderful medley of stalls with homemade produce for sale: cakes, preserves, apple pressing; a cider competition, and of course our apple display was in full swing, including samples for people to taste free of charge. Several people signed up for details of our grafting course which takes place in February.

For the tasting we used eight varieties Gala, Schneewitchen (Germany), Weirouge (Germany) and Rubinola (Czech Republic). To these we added four of our own seedlings, three of which were red fleshed. To our surprise, 83 people sampled all 8 and chose their favourite; the busiest we've ever been at this event.

There was a large number of visitors; one person even brought an apple to identify - it was King Edward 7th, a long-storing cooker.

We are grateful to the Donisthorpe Community Group for inviting us; we have been attending their apple days now for about a decade. Their next will be on 12 October 2025.

### Over 65,000 bulbs planted across the district

More than 65,000 bulbs will be planted across the district thanks to North West Leicestershire District Council's (NWLDC) Green Shoots Scheme and the support of the community.

District Councils and community From the beginning of June to the beginning of September, Parish Councils and community groups in North West Leicestershire were able to apply for bulbs and there were 24 successful applications.

Groups only paid half the price of the bulbs and NWLDC match funded the other 50%. Groups only michael Wyatt, Portfolio Holder for Communities and Climate Change at NWLDC, Councillor Michael Wyatt, Portfolio Holder for Communities and Climate Change at NWLDC, said: "This year's Green Shoots Scheme has truly blossomed, with an incredible 65,000 bulbs given away to be planted across North West Leicestershire. It's fantastic to see our communities and Parish Councils coming together to bring colour and life to our public spaces. These efforts will not only enhance the beauty of our district, but also create thriving environments for local wildlife. I'm looking forward to seeing these vibrant blooms next spring, and I know they will make a real difference for residents and visitors alike."
