

We have to inform you that we have a vacancy on the Parish Council. Sadly, owing to work commitments, we have lost Cllr. Helen Gravett (one of our two Donisthorpe resident councillors). MVAS Data for June to August

ODAPC has three speed monitors which are moved quarterly by volunteers and /or councillors. The monitors are there to remind drivers of the speed limit. They are in 30 or 40 mph zones.

This data was collected from June – August 2024

Measham Road, Acresford - 30 limit

Average speed: 32 mph

Max speed: 65mph on 13/07/24 @ 18.05pm

Total vehicles: 81,624

AADT (Annual Average Daily Traffic): 1,295

Percentage over 30mph: 57%, averaging 36mph.

This data was collected from June – August 2024

A444, Acresford - 40 limit Average Speed: 33 mph

Max speed: 85mph on 30/08/24 @ 8.25am

Total vehicles: 238,738

AADT (Annual Average Daily Traffic): 6,167

Percentage over 40mph: 5%, averaging 43mph.

This information is discussed at ODAPC meetings, but decisions about traffic calming and enforcement rest with the Police and County Council.

Apply for Pension Credit to retain Winter Fuel Allowance says Council

Older people in North West Leicestershire are being encouraged to claim the Pension Credit they're entitled to, in order to unlock access to Winter Fuel Allowance. The government recently announced that only pensioners in receipt of Pension Credit will now receive the Winter Fuel Allowance, instead of it being a universal payment received by all people of pensionable age, as was the case in previous years.

The plans mean that the allowance will only normally be paid to those receiving a pension of less than £218.15 a week (or £332.95 a week for couples). Amid fears that some of the district's most vulnerable people would be affected by this change, councillors have agreed to increase awareness of the upcoming national changes, by encouraging people to take up Pension Credit.

It's estimated that only around 63% of eligible people claim Pension Credit. It means that a great number of households in the district could increase their annual income by applying for the additional benefit, which will then entitle them to Winter Fuel Allowance too.

To find out whether you are eligible, or to make an application, go to www.gov.uk/pension-credit/how-to-claim or call free on 0800 99 1234 (lines are open Mon to Fri, 8am to 6pm). If you have an elderly family member or neighbour that you feel could be entitled to Pension Credit, maybe you could point them in the right direction, or help them to apply?
