# Fly High with Air Cadets

Join the adventure with the air cadets – the recruitment window is now open. Young people who would like to get the opportunity to fly should be 12 years and over and can now sign up with Swadlincote's Air Cadets for the autumn intake in early September.

Those who join cadets not only get the chance to fly, but also can qualify in first aid and fieldcraft skills. They can join the squadron band, take part in drill contests and compete in athletics, swimming and cross country events against cadet squadrons from all over the midlands. Cadets with specific skills are also encouraged to qualify for specialist team sports such as hockey, football, rugby and netball, which involves playing matches against teams from all over the country.

The Duke of Edinburgh Award is also on offer, as well as the opportunity for older cadets to gain a BTEC qualification. Swadlincote 1211 Squadron meets at Eureka Park John Street, Swadlincote on Tuesday and Thursday evenings.

# MVAS Data for May to July

ODAPC has three speed monitors which are moved quarterly by volunteers and /or councillors. The monitors are to remind drivers of the speed limit, they are in 30mph zones. This information is discussed at ODAPC meetings, but decisions about traffic calming and enforcement rest with the Police and County Council. The following data was collected between May and July 2024.

#### Measham Road, Oakthorpe - 30 limit

Average speed: 30.1 mph

Max speed: 70mph on 25/05/24 @ 00.25

Total vehicles: 188,943

AADT (Annual Average Daily Traffic): 2952 Percentage over 30mph: 16% averaging 39 mph

### Hill St, Donisthorpe - 30 limit

Average speed: 32 mph

Max speed: 70mph on 08/06/24 @ 22.26

Total vehicles: 20,943

AADT (Annual Average Daily Traffic): 1756
Percentage over 30mph: 7% averaging 39 mph
