

Our centurion resident Rita Leadenham, known to many as the Egg Lady, sadly passed away on 6th May at her home in Oakthorpe, where she had lived her full 100 years. She will be sadly missed by all that knew her, but especially by her granddaughters and her great grandchildren.

It has been a pleasure to see that the revamped Oakthorpe play area has been enjoyed by many in

the village.

There have been some invasive weeds found in the woods at the bottom of Silver Street in Oakthorpe. It is called Himalayan Balsam. It has pink flowers and grows very tall; the flowers are similar to snap dragons. If you come across it, please just pull it up and lay it to the side to

rot. It is easy to pull out and once removed will not grow back.

At our June Parish Council meeting we had a visit from the Neighbourhood Watch coordinator for Hinckley, which was very informative. Earlier this year, members of the Orchard Allotment Society travelled to RHS Wisley for the day. If you have not visited before it really is well worth the journey south.

There are the usual facilities, a well-stocked garden shop selling a wide range of products to suit all tastes and budgets, and eateries to match different palates and pockets.

The real reason for the visit soon appears as you walk around the diverse range of displays, planting and walks on offer across the site. It was hard to keep focused as every corner

turned brought new horticultural delights. Hats off to the fantastic volunteers and staff

involved in maintaining the site.



The Glasshouse journey through gigantic tree ferns, cacti and succulents towering overhead was breathtaking. A canal, busy with water lilies and fish, meanders beneath stunning terraces. Cross one of the bridges to wander upwards through the terraces towards yet more horticultural delights. The Alpine House is well worth a walk through, with beautiful displays of alpine plants, well presented in an environment they can thrive in. Nearby is a Bonsai Walk, with an avenue of striking structural bonsai to wander through - peaceful and almost surreal.

There are so many gardens, borders and meadows with different themes: wellbeing, exotic, mediterranean, world food, wildlife, roses, orchard, the Jubilee Arboretum, Back

to Nature, rock garden, walled garden, Alpine and a Heather meadow - and so much more. The Equinox Borders need a visit timed to experience them at their best, in Spring and Autumn.
